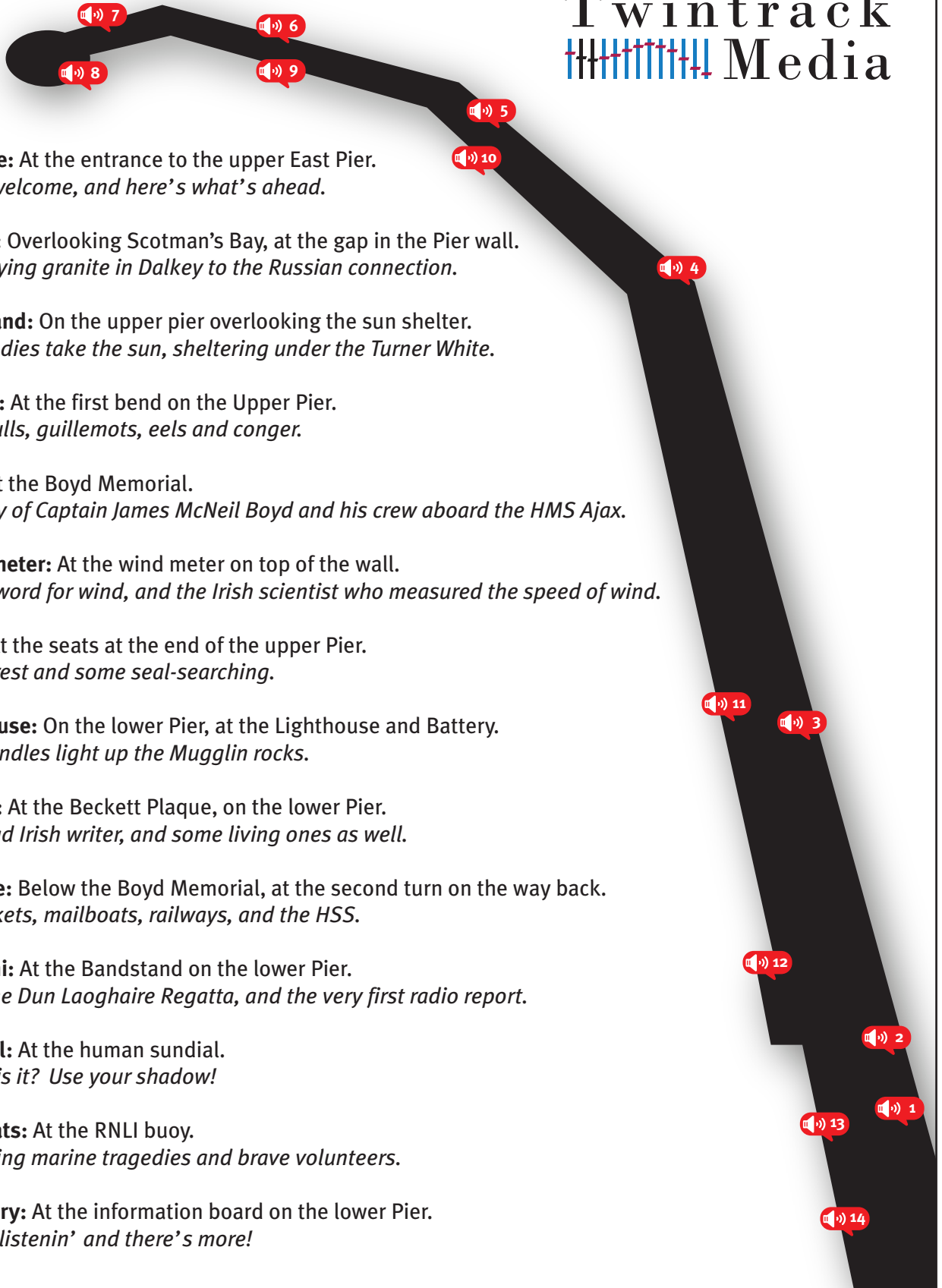

[1] **Welcome:** At the entrance to the upper East Pier.
Hello and welcome, and here's what's ahead.

[2] **Cannon:** Overlooking Scotman's Bay, at the gap in the Pier wall.
From quarrying granite in Dalkey to the Russian connection.

[3] **Bandstand:** On the upper pier overlooking the sun shelter.
Victorian ladies take the sun, sheltering under the Turner White.

[4] **Wildlife:** At the first bend on the Upper Pier.
Spot the gulls, guillemots, eels and conger.

[5] **Boyd:** At the Boyd Memorial.
The tragedy of Captain James McNeil Boyd and his crew aboard the HMS Ajax.

[6] **Anemometer:** At the wind meter on top of the wall.
The Greek word for wind, and the Irish scientist who measured the speed of wind.

[7] **Seals:** At the seats at the end of the upper Pier.
Time for a rest and some seal-searching.

[8] **Lighthouse:** On the lower Pier, at the Lighthouse and Battery.
226,000 candles light up the Mugglin rocks.

[9] **Beckett:** At the Beckett Plaque, on the lower Pier.
A great dead Irish writer, and some living ones as well.

[10] **Carlisle:** Below the Boyd Memorial, at the second turn on the way back.
Steam packets, mailboats, railways, and the HSS.

[11] **Marconi:** At the Bandstand on the lower Pier.
Marconi, the Dun Laoghaire Regatta, and the very first radio report.

[12] **Sundial:** At the human sundial.
What time is it? Use your shadow!

[13] **Lifeboats:** At the RNLI buoy.
Remembering marine tragedies and brave volunteers.

[14] **Dunleary:** At the information board on the lower Pier.
